A1 UPGRADE

FENCE ON HOLD

Moor Road residents in Melsonby reacted quickly to a proposal for a fence to separate their rear gardens from the village playing field. Councillors at the Environmental Committee discussed an emergency motion request by Councillor John Gill and they agreed - to put the proposal on hold and seek further information. Residents in Catterick Village have mixed views about a replacement fence in the Kings Close Play Area, where there are complaints about balls going into gardens.

COLBURN OFFICE MOVE

The District Council move to Colburn is on hold. No further expenditure will be made on the project. Councillors also agreed by 14 votes to 13 to await the outcome of the legal challenge by the Save Our Shires group, to the Councils previous activities and after which decide what office space the Council needs.

HEALTH REPORT

North Yorkshire County Council Scrutiny of Health Committee (NYCC) is still seeking a complete review of health service provision in North Yorkshire, despite The Strategic Health Authority changing its mind on doing so.

Inherited debts of £80m for the new PCT Area and savings demanded by government of £64m are unresolved and unclear how this can be achieved, without serious loss of services and jobs.

Doctors are being told to refuse patients access to consultants. One doctor claimed to have been sent a list of operations no longer available at NHS Hospitals. A three million pound saving has to be made, by refusing referrals. Delays in treatment lead to emergencies and are more costly in the long run. The system abuses doctors clinical judgements.

Dentistry Primary Health Care Trusts have a three year supply of money for NHS Dentistry. This remains available, even though dentists opt to go private. It is up to PCTs to set up NHS practices in their areas.

Pharmacy. A proposal for a Chemists Shop in Catterick Village has had minimal support from bodies considered for consultation. The scheme, devised by Government, would give a monopoly of dispensing in a mile radius of a chemists shop and deprive the Health Centre Dispensary.

Out of Hours. Statistics offered to the NYCC meeting, were twelve months out of date. Hambleton and Richmondshire had the highest number of standards not met. Health officials assured the committee that the picture was now much better, but could only offer an update of figures six months old, to be produced later.

Coming Soon. The NYCC Health Scutiny Committee is to meet next in Richmondshire and then at Stokesley.

ASSISTED SUICIDE

'Care not Killing' is a response to the Joffe Bill before Parliament, which, if passed, would allow assisted deaths. The British Medical Association has taken a neutral stance, but this is being challenged as not representing current medical preference against the proposed practice. It costs only four pounds in drugs to assist a suicide and this raises concerns for manipulation and persuasion.
